Applicants should be UK or EU nationals and should have a first class or 2:1 honours degree in English/English & Creative Writing or related Arts subjects or publications. (NB Applications for the AHRC studentship cannot be considered from those who already hold MA, M.Phil. or Ph.D. qualifications, though such applicants are welcome to apply for the course.)

Closing date for applicants for MA Creative Writing award: 10.00 am 5th March 2012. **Interviews** will take place on 23rd March 2012. 1-4pm.

Decision: the successful candidate will be notified by telephone on Monday 26th March 2012 of our intention to offer a bursary based on successful references and acceptance of the offer. Once this process is completed the successful candidate will be given a formal offer letter, after which they will be guided through the completion of the necessary AHRC documentation.

Candidates being offered a place on the MA without a Bursary will be informed of this decision within a week and have a month to accept the offer.
